HABITAT FOR HUMANITY FINDING HER WAY BACK HOME

As a young girl, Candice found herself making wrong decisions at every turn. “I had my daughter Gillian when I was just 17. By 19, her father and I had split up and agreed on joint custody. I was moving from job to job and was back to my mom’s house often,” says Candice. “At the age of 20, I had my son, Caleb. By 25, I had been in and out of jail for traffic issues and a drug charge. As I bounced from job to job and made disappointing choices, I got married and had my third child, Elijah.”

In the midst of it all, God was moving in Candice’s life even though she didn’t recognize it. She says she received a “wake-up call” when the Department of Children and Families (DCF) knocked on her door. “Gillian was 8, Caleb was 5 and Elijah was just 3 months old. I told DCF that I knew something had to change. I agreed to grant temporary custody to my mom for the boys, while Gillian went to live with her father,” she explains.

"I felt such shame and guilt, but I still thought I could straighten it out by myself. That definitely did not work. Over the next four years, my husband and I divorced. I was doing drugs and could not keep a job due to partying. Then rock bottom found me, and so did Jesus."

In May of 2013, Candice sat in front of the hospital in labor with her fourth child, Angelica. She felt desperate and alone. "My boyfriend didn't stay with me. I knew where he'd rather be. So I called the compassionate OBGYN who had delivered Gillian, Caleb and Elijah," she says, "When his wife answered the phone, I was bluntly honest about my situation. She kindly said, 'He's on his way.' Then I called the kids' pediatrician and he came to the hospital as well. What a miracle. I said one simple prayer, 'Father, I give this child to you.' In my heart, I've always known His will is best."

When Candice's OBGYN arrived, he delivered Angelica and then also delivered some hard truths. "He definitely told me all about myself! I deserved it. Angelica was small but completely healthy. Thank You, Jesus," she says. "Then DCF came to the hospital room to say this child would also go with my mother. My mother said, 'Yes, but Candice needs to come also.' They approved. I have been sober since that day, and wholeheartedly seek Jesus to guide me in all things."

Candice was required to attend Narcotics Anonymous meetings and found a Celebrate Recovery meeting at First Alliance (now Movement Church). She also started to attend Sunday service regularly and in 2017 became a member of the church. "By God's great grace, I was able to keep a job, pay my fines, get my license back, start technical college and be awarded full custody with Caleb, Elijah and Angelica within a year and a half! says Candice. "I completed technical school at the top of my class in automotive mechanics."

But she was still searching for stable, affordable housing so that she and her children could have a place of their own to call home. "I applied at the Punta Gorda Housing Authority (PGHA) and got approved for an apartment, but then immediately began working on meeting the qualifications to apply for a Habitat for Humanity home."

Finally, in September of last year, Candice got approved for the first phase of the Habitat qualification process. “The start of the Habitat process seemed overwhelming. There were 300 sweat equity hours required. The Habitat Volunteer Coordinator asked if I could join her at a local church to help solicit volunteer sign ups, which would count toward my hours needed. When she sent me the church address, I absolutely fell to my knees. The address was to my church! I love the reassurance that our Lord presents to us, letting us know we are loved beyond understanding.”

After that Sunday volunteer sign up, many at Movement have poured out their hearts and time in helping to complete the 300 required hours. The children and I could not be more grateful! With the church’s support we completed 300 hrs within mere weeks. We are in the final stages of the house process with expected closing this month!

The Lord continues to offer redemption for all the enemy has stolen from Candice and her children. “Up until now, I felt I was simply surviving each next day,” says Candice. “With the opportunity to own our home I can now pour all of myself into my children to lead them in life through Christ.”
