Day 1 - Trust God

Bible Reading: Proverbs 3:5-8

Passage Breakdown

The book of Proverbs was written as wise sayings to help us know how to live the life that God designed for us to live. In these verses, Solomon tells us to trust only in God, that our own understanding is not enough to get us through life. Our own understanding can be flawed and fail us, but God never will. Human wisdom will always let us down. But when we follow God and trust Him in all things, He will guide us in the correct ways that lead to life and blessing.

Review Questions

- **What is the difference between human wisdom and God's wisdom?**
- **What is the result of trusting God and following His ways?**

Key Verse - Proverbs 3:5-6

Action Step: Too often, we lean on our own understanding and experience to get through life. But God's way is always best, there is no way around it. Trusting God is necessary to live a life pleasing to Him. Write down 3 things in your life that you need to trust in, rather than your own understanding.

Prayer: Dear God, help me to trust in you for all things. Let me not trust my own understanding or experience but rather trust in you. Amen.

Day 2 - Wise and Fools

Bible Reading: Proverbs 1:1-7

Passage Breakdown

The book of Proverbs is all about wisdom. Solomon begins the book of Proverbs by highlighting the importance of having wisdom. Without wisdom, we will live only in foolishness. Throughout the book of Proverbs, the fool continually faces destruction and ruin because of his actions and disdain for God and wisdom. Solomon tells us that true knowledge and wisdom comes from knowing and following God. However, the fools will experience destruction because they do not know or follow God.

Review Questions

- What does the Bible mean by the “fear” of the Lord?**

- Who do the fools put their trust and faith in?**

Key Verse - Proverbs 1:7

Action Step: Too often, we lean on our own understanding and experience to get through life. But God's way is always best, there is no way around it. Trusting God is necessary to live a life pleasing to Him. Write down 3 things in your life that you need to trust in, rather than your own understanding.

Prayer: Dear God, help me to trust in you for all things. Let me not trust my own understanding or experience but rather trust in you. Amen.

Day 3 - Wisdom over Wealth

Bible Reading: Proverbs 16

Passage Breakdown

Solomon was the king of Israel during its most prosperous time. He was loaded with wealth and possessions.

However, even with all of his wealth and possessions, he still recognized that the wisdom and understanding that comes from the Lord is better than any amount of gold and silver. Wealth, possessions, status, and influence will all fade away, but the truths of God will last forever!

Review Questions

- **Why does Solomon contrast wisdom and understanding with gold and silver? What does it reveal about where people put their trust?**
- **How do wealth and possessions distract us from God?**

Key Verse - Proverbs 16:16

Action Step: Too often, we lean on our own understanding and experience to get through life. We trust in our possessions and influence. But God's way is always best, there is no way around it. Trusting God is necessary to live a life pleasing to Him. Write down 3 things in your life that you need to trust in, rather than you own understanding.
